

FLINT RIVER PRESBYTERY
HABITAT FOR HUMANITY FUNDING
GRANT APPLICATION

Flint River Presbytery has a special fund earmarked to help a FRP church or group of churches build a Habitat for Humanity home in one of the communities within our bounds. The fund currently contains slightly more than \$62,000. By the time of the build, there may be a bit more. This is not enough to completely fund a build, so any church or group of churches will need to identify additional sources of funding to assist with the build. You may reach out to other churches (of other denominations), organizations or corporations who may be willing to partner with you on the project. Your local Habitat for Humanity chapter should be able to assist you with recruiting such partners.

FRP can only provide funding for one building project. Therefore, the application is a competitive process, and the church or group of churches that presents the best plan will be awarded the funding. The plan should be conceived with the assistance of your local Habitat for Humanity chapter. You will need to explain to them that you may not be awarded this funding. If the project is to be executed by a group of churches, one church should be identified as the "lead church" that will provide leadership for the project, and whose primary contact will serve as the liaison with both FRP and the local Habitat for Humanity chapter.

The application deadline is June 30, 2022. The build should be planned for the fall of 2022 or the spring of 2023. Send applications to Pam Moyer at pambmoye@charter.net and to Elizabeth Cantrell at ecantrell@flintriverpresbytery.org. Only electronic applications will be accepted.
